January Jobless Rates Up Seasonally in All Michigan **Regional Labor Markets**

Lansing - Seasonally unadjusted unemployment rates in January rose in all of the state's 17 major labor market areas, according to the Michigan Department of Technology, Management & Budget. Total employment fell seasonally over the month in most regions, while workforce levels increased in nearly all areas.

"Michigan's local markets recorded very typical seasonal trends in January as job levels declined and unemployment rates advanced," said Jason Palmer, director of the Bureau of Labor Market Information & Strategic Initiatives. "Over the year, payroll jobs rose in the majority of the state's regions and workforce levels continued to increase in all major areas."

From December to January, unemployment rates advanced in all 17 regions, with increases ranging from 0.7 to 1.9 percentage points, and a median gain of 1.1 percentage points. The largest overthe-month rate advances were posted in the Northeast and Northwest Lower Michigan regions, with rate hikes of 1.9 and 1.5 percentage points respectively. Three other areas recorded January rate increases of 1.4 percentage points. In January, six of the 17 Michigan regions displayed unemployment rates at or below the national seasonally unadjusted rate of 5.1 percent.

Unemployment Rates Up Over Year

Since January 2016, jobless rates rose in 16 regions. Rate increases ranged from 0.2 to 1.1 percentage points with a moderate median advance of a half percentage point. The largest overthe-year jobless rate hikes occurred in the Northeast Lower Michigan region (+1.1), the Upper Peninsula (+0.8), and the Detroit-Warren-Dearborn Metropolitan Statistical Area (MSA) (+0.8). The unemployment rate in the Lansing-East Lansing MSA was unchanged over the year.

Total Employment Down Over Month, Up Over Year

From December to January, total employment fell seasonally in 14 regions. Over-the-month reductions ranged from -0.3 to -1.4 percent, with a median decline of -0.8 percent. Total employment increased slightly in the Grand Rapids-Wyoming and Muskegon MSAs in January, while the employment level in the Lansing-East Lansing MSA was essentially unchanged.

Since January 2016 total employment rose in 16 regions, with the areas displaying a solid 1.3 percent median gain. The most pronounced over-the-year increases were posted in the Kalamazoo-Portage, Grand Rapids-Wyoming, and Lansing-East Lansing MSAs, with employment levels up by around 3.0 percent each. Total employment was down slightly over the year in the Midland MSA.

Note: Labor force, employment, and unemployment data for all 12 months of 2016 have been recently revised. Payroll job data by industry was revised for 2015 and 2016. Labor Force Levels Up Over Month, Year

During January, workforce levels rose moderately in 16 state regions and declined in the Ann Arbor MSA (-0.6%). Labor force increases over the month ranged from 0.1 to 1.4 percent, with the largest advances posted in the Muskegon and Grand Rapids-Wyoming MSAs along with the Northeast Lower Michigan region.

Between January 2016 and January 2017, labor force levels were up in all 17 regions, recording a solid 1.7 percent median growth rate.

Seasonal Drop in January Payroll Jobs

The monthly survey of employers indicated that seasonally unadjusted payroll jobs in Michigan fell by 77,000 or 1.8 percent in January to 4,302,000. Typical seasonal job cuts over the month were registered in trade, transportation and utilities (-26,000), government (-15,000), construction (-9,000), education and health services (-9,000), professional and business services (-7,000), and leisure and hospitality services (-6,000).

Within trade, transportation and utilities, retail trade jobs fell by 17,000 in January as merchants cut seasonal jobs with the end of the holiday shopping period. Within education and health services, 7,000 of the job reduction was due to temporary declines in private education, while jobs were cut in both local and state government education as local schools and universities were not fully staffed after the holiday break.

In January, payroll jobs declined in all of the state's 14 major metropolitan regions. Regional job cuts ranged from -1.0 to -3.2 percent, with a median reduction of -2.2 percent. The largest January job declines were reported in the Ann Arbor (-3.2%), Saginaw (-3.1%), and Midland (-2.7%) MSAs.

Since January 2016, seasonally unadjusted payroll jobs rose statewide by 87,000 or 2.1 percent. All major industry sectors in the state recorded job gains since January 2016, and were led by increases in professional and business services (+23,000), leisure and hospitality services (+15,000), government (+14,000), education and health services (+9,000), and financial activities (+7,000).

Since January 2016, payroll jobs increased in nine of the 14 Michigan metro areas, for a 1.8 percent median advance. The largest over-the-year percentage job gains were displayed in the Grand Rapids-Wyoming, Kalamazoo-Portage, and Lansing-East Lansing MSAs. Payroll jobs declined over the year in the Monroe, Jackson, Muskegon, Midland, and Saginaw MSAs.

County Jobless Rates Up Over Month, Year

Eighty of Michigan's 83 counties recorded seasonal jobless rate jumps in January with a median increase of 1.3 percentage points.

Since January 2016, unemployment rates rose in 76 counties, with a moderate median increase of 0.6 of a percentage point. Unemployment rates declined in three counties over the year, while the rates were unchanged in four.

Note: Data in this release is **not seasonally adjusted**. As a result, employment and unemployment trends may differ from previously released Michigan seasonally adjusted data. A breakdown of seasonally unadjusted January workforce estimates for Michigan and its 17 major labor market areas follows, along with a listing of county jobless rates for January.
